With reference to the appointment of Mr Gerald Flood, as Assistant Surveyor, the following resolution was adopted on the motion of the Chairman, seconded by Mr O'Neill:-

Courtown Harbour.

Under date 21st April 1914, Sir T. Esmonde, wrote forwarding the following copy of a letter which he had received from Mr Birrell:-

"I have received your letter of the 24th instant, and enclosed Memorial relative to Courtown Harbour, which I have read with interest.

I have had the matter under consideration and I hope to bring the case of the Harbour before the Development Commissioners at an early date with the view of obtaining a grant, if possible, for the improvement of the Harbour."

The Courtown Harbour Committee, at their meeting on 5th May, recommended the appointment of Mr Walter Gahan, Courtown, as a member of the Committee, vice Mr A. Kelly resigned.

On the motion of Mr Fanning, Seconded by the Chairman, the following resolution was adopted:-

"That the name of Mr Walter Gahan, be added to Courtown Harbour Committee, vice Mr A. Kelly resigned."

Recommendations of Finance & Roads Committee.

The following recommendations from the Finance & Roads Committee, in respect of Meeting on 29th April 1914, were laid before the Meeting:-

New Ross Bridge.

"That Mr Barry, County Surveyor, be instructed to procure four Notice Boards warning masters of vessels against hanging on to dolphins, the warping buoys, or the bridge itself."

Reports of County Surveyor.

"That in future when there is a large amount of work dealt with in his report, the County Surveyor furnish a copy of his report to the Members of the Finance & Roads Committee."

Blacksmith's Wages- Tara Hill Quarry.

In connection with the application of Patrick Byrne, blacksmith at Tara
Hill Quarry, for an increase in his salary of £1 per week, and which was laid
Before the Finance & Roads Committee Meeting by Mr Barry, County Surveyor,
the Committee agreed to the following:-

"That an increase of 2/- per week be recommended to be given by the Co. Council to Patrick Byrne, blacksmith at Tara Hill Quarry."

Cherryorchard Quarry.

In connection with the working of Cherryorchard Quarry, it was decided at the Meeting of the Finance & Roads Committee:- "That the County Council be recommended to allow Mr George Sharpe, to charge a sum of 3/6 per cubic yard for road metalling, and 2/- for screenings taken out of Cherryorchard Quarry, under new agreement to be drafted by Mr Elgee, Solicitor, in consultation with the County Surveyor."

Railway Rates-Gt S. & W. Rly Co.,

Mr Elgee reported to the Meeting of the Finance & Roads Committee that he had attended the Conference of Public Bodies on 7th inst., and submitted the copy of Minutes and Circular which is being issued to Traders. he had informed the Conference that he had no authority to bind the Wexford County Council as to the payment of any expenses of an Expert Witness on Railway finance, or in any other way, or as to whether the Council would lodge any objection to the proposed increased rates, or appear before the Railway Commission.

The Committee had adopted the following:-

"That Mr Elgee, Solicitor endeavour to ascertain the approximate amount of contribution which Wexford County Council should make in order to fall into line with the other public bodies which are opposing the increase of railway rates proposed by the Gt Southern & Western Railway Co.,"

In connection with this matter, a Circular letter was read from the Railway Clerks' Association of Gt Britain & Ireland, asking the Public Bodies to withdraw their opposition to the increase of four per cent in freight rates proposed by the Irish Railway Companies, on condition that an undertaking is given by these Companies to the Railway and Canal Commissioners that a sufficient sum will be allocated from such increase in rates to provide for an adequate improvement of the conditions of their salaried and wages staff."

Marked "Read"

On the motion of Mr Fanning, Seconded by Mr Peacocke, the following resolution was adopted:-

"That the Secretary communicate with the County Councils of Dublin, Wicklow, Carlow, and Kilkenny, and ask them if they are prepared to consider the advisability of joining with the Wexford County Council in opposing the proposed increase of Rates of the Dublin & South Eastern Railway Co.,"

Irreceverable Rates.

The Finance & Reads Committee considered disallowances by the Local

Government Board in several of the Irrecoverable Rates Lists of the Rate Collectors.

The following recommendation was adopted:-

"That in cases of claims for payment of irrecoverable rates in which lands and buildings are jointly rated, and which have been disallowed by the Local Government Board, we would request the Local Government Board to allow refund to the Collectors in respect of the half-year ended 31st March 1914, as we are satisfied that the amounts claimed by the Collectors are irrecoverable, and that it was through inadvertence they did not make application for special receipts. That the Collectors who failed to obtain Special Receipts in these instances be informed, that in future they must suffer any loss which may arise through their neglect to comply with the instructions of the Local Government Board in this matter.

That as regards the reference in the letter of the Local Government

Board to Collector P.Rossiter having signed these receipts, we are satisfied

with the Collector's statement that he has not done so, and a close examination

of the receipts bears out the Collector's statement."

"The Secretary stated that the Local Government Board, under date 4th
May 1914, letter No.23253, had written that in order to meet the wishes of the
Council, they would assent on this occasion to amounts, which were not
reconcilable, being regarded as irrecoverable. In future, the Collectors
must be prepared to follow the Board's instructions, or abide the consequences."

Petty Sessions Clerk's Office for Wexford.

Mr M.Kavanagh, Petty Sessions Clerk, Wexford, wrote applying for an office, as the Registrar of Petty Sessions, had decided that there should be a public office provided. Heretofore, he had held the office in his own private house, but the authorities had decided that this should not continue in future.

The Finance & Roads Committee at their meeting held on 1st April had adopted a resolution requesting the High Sheriff to agree to an office being provided in the Courthouse.

At the meeting of the Committee on 29th April, a letter was read from the High Sheriff, stating that he would not consent to any change from the present office, unless some very material public advantage was attained.

The Committee had adopted the following recommendation:-

"That we recommend the County Council to pay Mr M. Kavanagh, £10 per annum, as from 31st March 1914, to provide a suitable office for Wexford Petty

Sessions, and which sum is to provide for heating and lighting.

Under date 30th April, Mr M. Kavanagh wrote, accepting the offer of the Committee.

Mr Rossiter proposed, and Mr J. A. Doyle seconded, the following resolution:-

"That the recommendation of the Finance & Roads Committee be confirmed."

As an amendment Mr Asple proposed and Mr Fanning seconded the following resolution:-

"That this matter be postponed to next meeting of the Council."

On a show of hands the amendment was lost by 7 to 3 and the confirmation of the Finance & Roads Committee Minute, was put and passed.

A Case in connection with Rates.

Under date 25th April, Mr R. W. Elgee wrote that in connection with the case-J. Murphy & Others v Edward J. Murphy, Rate Collector, and the Wexford County Council, which had been several times adjourned, a question would arise at the next hearing that the Rate was bad, the occupiers being described as the "Cesspayers of Bantry", who of course no longer existed. He suggested the employment of Counsel to argue the matter on behalf of the County Council.

The matter was considered at the meeting of the Finance & Reads Committee on 29th April, when the following recommendation was adopted:-

"That Mr Elgee, Seliciter, be empowered to employ Counsel to represent the Wexford County Council at Quarter Sessions in the case of J. Murphy & Others v E. J. Murphy Rate Collector, and Wexford County Council."

Ballingly Quarry.

The following recommendation in connection with Ballingly Quarry, was adopted at the meeting of the Finance & Roads Committee on 29th April:-

"That the lease of Ballingly Quarry from James Byrne, Ballingly, to Wexford County Council for £5 per annum be sealed and signed."

Payment for Works in Charge of County Surveyor.

The following recommendation from the Finance & Roads Committee, was read::

"That Mr Peacecke, be requested to attend before the Local Government
Auditor of the County Council Accounts, on his next visit to Wexford, and
explain to him the difficulty which exists in dealing with payments for wages
on Works in charge of the County Surveyor and for quarries, and that Mr Peacecke
request the Auditor to allow the County Council to place a certain sum in the
hands of the County Surveyor to meet said payments."

Desk for Ex-officie Inspector-Weights & Measures.

The following recommendation of the Finance & Roads Committee in connection with an application of the County Inspector, R. I. C., for a desk for the use of Ex-officio Inspector of Weights & Measures, was read:-

"That we recommend the purchase of plain desk by Ex-efficie Inspector of Weights & Measures for Wexford District, cost not to exceed 15/-"

Fethard Lifebuey.

With reference to remeval of Fethard Life Buey in connection with Fethard Disaster, the following recommendation from the Finance & Reads Committee was read:-

"That the County Surveyor claim cost of replacing lifebuoy at Fethard from Life Boat Institution."

Opening of Bascules of Wexford & Ferrycarrig Bridges.

At the meeting of the Finance & Reads Committee on 29th April, an application was considered from the British Reinforced Concrete & Engineering Co., as to the opening of the bascules of Wexford & Ferrycarrig Bridges.

"The Committee decided to leave the matter in the hands of the County Surveyor."

"On the metien of Mr Peacocke, seconded by Mr Fanning, the resolutions of the Finance & Reads Committee were confirmed."
