In the course of the discussion it appeared that the following are the excisting Drainage Schemes in the County, viz., Kilmannock, The Sow, Cohore and Ballyleigue. With the exception of Ballyleigue (regarding which no question of improvement is at present continplateib) copies of the original Schemes had been furnished to the County Council.

Frosesor D' Sullivan explained that in connection with the works at the Sow and Kilmannock it was necessary these should be no delay: if everbody interested was consulted the works would have been held up and could not have been started until nest year and this delay would have caused the Scheme. To be more expensive. As regards reports of the Engineers of the Board, being supplied to the loundy tound no Government, separtment would supply these reports in full but he would be prepared to supply any partialars dealing with adual construction.
